MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear St. Agnes School Parents,

Thank you to all who have been joining us for our many Catholic Schools Week activities! We were so happy to have so many families with us for our Parish Mass on Sunday and our Parent lunch yesterday.

Thanks to our Parents' Club for the coffee and donuts they hosted on Sunday and for the pizza lunch for students and their gift of sunglasses. The sunglasses are a hit. We ask all students to hold on to these as we will ask them to bring them back to wear at a special assembly we will be having soon to celebrate our new "solar panels"!

Today, we celebrate Vocations' Day. As we celebrated the Feast of the Presentation, the Feast of light, at our All-school liturgy we will honor the vocation of marriage. Following Mass, Fr. Bob will expose the Blessed Sacrament for adoration throughout the morning so that we can pray for more vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Some of our Dominican sisters will come for refreshments in the library and visit some of our classrooms. This afternoon various parents/parishioners will be presenting in our classrooms so that children learn about their various careers.

Tomorrow, Friday, we will be celebrating our teachers and staff with their Appreciation Day! Please help me express appreciation to our staff for their love and care of your children. I am very proud of our St. Agnes staff and am grateful for their choice to teach and/or minister St. Agnes School. The Student Council have been asked to bring treats for their breakfast and to arrive at school by 7:15 a.m. on this day to help serve the teachers. There will be an assembly to honor our teachers and staff at 10:00 a.m. Lunch will be provided. Dismissal is at 1:30 p.m. which ends our week of celebrating Catholic education!

One of the activities that was a part of Catholic Schools week on Monday, was the "Random Act of Kindness Day". It is always nice to receive but our joy doubles in giving to others and seeing the smiles of those who receive. Our children represented their school and you, their families, beautifully! We began our day with the seventh graders taking donuts to the Dominican Sisters, the co-workers and to the Priests and Parish staff. Our Student Council visited and took inspirational rocks that they had painted and treats to the Firemen, Mrs. Carolyn Harris, a retired teacher, the Administrative staff at Sacred Heart Griffin, staff at the Diocesan Office of Education, Contact Ministries, Mercy Communities and St. Martin DePorres and began a "pay it forward" at Starbucks.

We are deeply grateful to our teachers and staff who have spent so much time preparing the building and continuing to welcome all into our school. Thanks to our Room Parents and the "Gala" committee for your creative baskets! Many thanks to our Parents' Club for all of their support!

There are many attachments in today's Newsletter. They include: multiple forms about our approaching "Gala", including ticket, raffle and table information, the Parents' Club Family Fitness night, a fund raiser for the eighth grade class and a thank you and invitation to join our school committees. Please get a cup of coffee/tea or a cold drink and take some time to review them.

Our Parish "Gala" is approaching very quickly! If you are donating any item or a basket, it would be helpful to have those items in on Friday, February 10th. Thank you to so many who have already donated items.

Parents, we seem to be having more of a problem than usual with head lice. The problem has been in the 3rd, 4th & 5th grades. But yesterday and today we have had calls from parents of students in 1st and 7th grades. We will be bringing in some nurses to check the heads of all of our students. But for now I will be sending home today a letter concerning how to deal with this problem. The information will be given to each student. When lice are found, you must wash and dry all items that a child has been using in

addition to shampooing with the right shampoo. We will continue reminding our children not to play with one another's hair (which seems to be a popular thing) and not to share hats, gloves or other clothing.

We have already begun preparing now for our Open House for the public that will be held on Tuesday evening, February 21st, from 6:00 p.m. until 7:30 p.m. The Open House is for those families who want to visit and find out more about our school. Our current families are invited to bring a family with them that might be interested in attending. There will be members of the Student Council, our School Board and Parents' Club who help with the tours and refreshments, but if you know a family already it is good to come with them to help them feel welcome.

Letters will be sent next week about the Open House to all families with new students who have already filled out a communications card for the 2017-2018 school year. If you know a family that will be attending for the first time, please encourage them to call and give us their mailing information. Our own families will receive your re-registration forms on Monday, February 27th, after the registration weekend for new students which is Saturday, February 25th and Sunday, February 26th, after all of the Masses. It is important for our current preschool to reregister as soon as possible for the four year old preschool so that your places are reserved for the new school year. Families with children already in the school are assured of a space for your incoming child.

The Parents Club' SCRIP program ends April 30th for this school year. On May 1st, the program begins anew for the following school year. Remember that 50% of what is earned as profit goes to you to be applied to school expenses. The other 50% is used by the Parents' Club for their activities that support the school. Parents who have not fulfilled commitments will be asked to pay the buyout.

GRADE 4

4th graders were introduced to Mathletics, a new online program that we are currently piloting in 4th & 5th grade. This program can be used both at home and at school. Mathletics will allow students to review skills, like math facts and concepts learned in the classroom, as well as a variety of other skills and concepts. Students are encouraged to show parents this program and explore it at home. We have ventured into the South Central region of the USA in Social Studies. 4th graders are continuing their concept maps as a way of taking notes. In math, we are continuing to review our facts through completing input-output charts. We have been working with variables and algebraic equations as well. We will be venturing into Order of Operations also.

LIBRARY

Do you have any books (PreK-8) that you have purchased and no longer want? 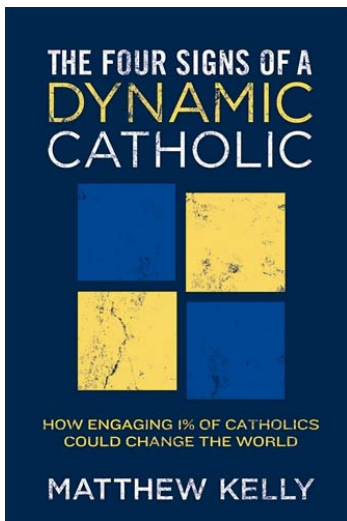
